BIG BETHEL AMEC PASTOR: DR. JAY AUGUSTINE



Dr. Jonathan C. Augustine serves as senior pastor of Big Bethel AME Church, the oldest Black church in Atlanta, GA, and as a member of the inaugural faculty at the Hampton University School of Religion. Dr. Augustine is an accomplished author, sought-after speaker, and internationally recognized academic leader.

Prior to leading Big Bethel, for six-years, Augustine led St. Joseph AME Church (Durham, NC), while serving on the faculties of North Carolina Central University Law School and Duke University Divinity School, where he was a member of the Board of Visitors and chaplain to the Duke Football Team. For the four years prior to leading St. Joseph, Augustine served as senior minister at Historic St. James AME Church (New Orleans, LA) the oldest predominantly Black, Protestant congregation in the Deep South, while also teaching at Southern University Law Center. He also served eight years as the general chaplain of his beloved Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

An accomplished author, his most recent books are *When Prophets Preach: Leadership and the Politics of the Pulpit* (Fortress Press, 2023) and *Called to Reconciliation: How the Church Can Model Justice, Diversity and Inclusion* (Baker Academic, 2022). His scholarly articles appear in publications including, the *University of Richmond Law Review*, *Howard Law Journal*, *Connecticut Public Interest Law Journal*, *Louisiana Law Review*, *Southern California Interdisciplinary Law Journal*, and *Theology Today*, among others.

Augustine serves as chairman of the board of the Agora Strategy Council of the Payne Center, a research-based "think tank" and affiliate of the Thurgood Marshall College Fund. He also serves as a member of the board of directors of PartnersGlobal, Inc., a non-profit organization headquartered in Washington, DC. He has been invited to lecture, internationally, in Heidelberg, Germany and Accra, Ghana; and has been nationally featured on C-SPAN Book-TV. His leadership was also nationally profiled, in March 2024, on the front page of USA Today.

A gifted and nationally celebrated communicator, Augustine was inducted into the Morehouse College Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers (2024) and elevated to serve as vice president of the Judicial Council (Supreme Court) of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. He was twice awarded the President's Lifetime Achievement Award for Volunteer Service (2024 & 2017), and previously named "Outstanding Alumni Brother of the Year," by Alpha Phi Alpha (2017). He also won the fraternity's Belford V. Lawson National Oratorical Scholarship (1994). As an emerging leader, Augustine received the Ten Outstanding Young Americans Award, from the U.S. Jaycees (2004) and was named to *Ebony Magazine's* "30 Leaders of the Future" (2001). He is an active member of Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity (Alpha Tau Boulé).

Dr. Augustine is married to his partner and friend, Michelle Burks Augustine. They are the proud parents of two college students, Mason and Jillian.

JAMAICA HONORARY CONSUL: DR. ELAINE BRYAN



Dr. Elaine Grant-Bryan is the first Caribbean American in Georgia to receive both the USA President's Lifetime Achievement & Volunteer Service Gold Awards. Currently appointed as Honorary Consul for Jamaica in Atlanta, Dr. Grant-Bryan has served thousands of Jamaicans in her capacity over the past five years. She is the owner of Elaine Bryan Realty and was selected as a real estate broker expert to commentate on HGTV and Fine Living Channel's "What You Get for the Money". Frequently requested to supply content as a columnist, Dr. Grant-Bryan is the author of many "Financial Freedom Columns."

Dr. Bryan is an alumnus of Northwestern University, the University of West Georgia, and Leadership Sandy Springs. Elaine has been acknowledged globally and is the recipient of the Mayor of Atlanta Phoenix, Judge Glenda Hatchett Mentor, and Picture of Health Noble Leadership Awards.

As a Registered Microsoft Education Partner, she developed and established Microsoft-EBF STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) Mentorship Programs in collaboration with The Elaine Bryan Foundation, a 501(C)(3) that she chairs. These students in the program have received laptops, internships, and job placement at Microsoft, Google, and other international corporations.

One of Dr. Grant-Bryan's strategic goals, as Honorary Consul for Jamaica in Atlanta, has been to nourish and further establish symbiotic relationships between the State of Georgia and Jamaica, whereby synergies for mutual opportunities can be explored. Expanding trade and investment opportunities is one of Dr. Grant-Bryan's highest priorities. She is forever guided by her trademark, "The What What What Approach - What you do with what you have determines what you become.™" Elaine is married to the love of her life, IT director, Gregory Scott Vernon Bryan.

Evette served in the Jamaica Youth Corps, and pursued higher education at the G.C. Foster College of Physical Education and Sports before beginning her teaching career at Campion College. She furthered her education at Barry University in Miami, earning a Bachelor of Business Administration degree, and subsequently

obtained a Master's degree in Global Business Administration from the University of Phoenix. Additionally, she attended Florida Atlantic University, where she took courses in Mass Communication.

Evette is a founding member of the United States Netball Association and currently serves as the President of the Atlanta Jamaican Association, where she dedicates her time to supporting the Jamaican community in Atlanta. The AJA, a 48-year-old organization, plays a crucial role in fostering community spirit and cultural pride among Jamaicans in Atlanta.

MUSICAL TRIBUTE: JULIAN K. SMITH JR.



ASALH VP PROGRAMS: SHARRON PAIGE





Sharron came to Atlanta in 1971 from a small town in Birmingham, Alabama. Her mother was an evangelist and homemaker, while her father was a farmer and gospel singer. She attended Morris Brown College, where she studied psychology, and later Georgia State University, where she studied business. Sharron is a recruiter for Maternal Substance Abuse and Child Development Studies at Emory University.

In the 1980s, activism became her passion after she completed a degree in Biblical Studies at the School of the Prophets for the Cathedral of Faith Church of God in Christ. Sharron traveled to West Africa twice as a missionary teaching about abstinence from drugs, alcohol and risky behavior. She has also worked in Nassau, Bahamas mentoring prisoners and providing resources for the homeless. After getting married and starting a family in the

1990s, family life became her focus until the passing of her gifted 23-year-old son Ahmad from testicular cancer in 2023.

Since 2016, Sharron has served as Vice President of Programs at the Association for the Study of African American Life & History (ASALH) branch in Atlanta. She is also the Youth Director for the "Know Thy Self Youth"; Assistant Chair for Atlanta's Juneteenth Committee for Band & Parade Festivities; Chair of the Atlanta Council of PTAs Reflections Art Program; Co-Chair of The Potters Wheel Prayer Ministry Youth Ministry & Young Adult Advisor. She has been blessed with the resources to empower youth to abstain from drugs and alcohol. Sharron remains steadfast in her mission to mentor youth in their relationship with God while developing life skills and gaining knowledge of themselves and black history. Last but not least she encourages them to learn how to grow healthy foods.

UKUMBUSHO EXHIBITION CURATOR: KIM POOLE



KIM POOLE is a Soul-Fusion performing artist, cultural strategist, and founding fellow of the Teaching Artist Institute (TAI). She is the creator of the Cultural Reparations Framework™, an African-centered approach that restores cultural autonomy, spiritual language, and collective meaning to legal and economic reparations instruments. Grounded in the principle that Spiritual Renaissance is the foundation of reparations, her work centers land, language, memory, and spirit as sites of regeneration.

Through the Teaching Artist Institute, for over a decade Poole has advanced Cooperative Repair, a reparative justice model rooted in shared ownership, cultural integrity, and collective healing. As a demonstration of true value, she teaches that "Culture is the New Currency," convening artists, faith leaders, and civil society

at international forums, including the United Nations, to advance cultural diplomacy and reparative futures, while also applying these practices within local communities, including her hometown of Baltimore.

In 2025, she led participatory, practice-based research at the Vatican Symposium on Reparatory Justice and Healing, where the Ukumbusho Cure emerged as a first applied "medicine" for institutional memory recovery and repair.

That same year, she was appointed to the African Union's African Academy of Languages (ACALAN), advancing African languages as living instruments of self-determination across the continent and the African Diaspora.

Higgins was a member of the internationally acclaimed Jamaican Folk Singers for over 23 years, performing under the direction of the late ethnomusicologist Dr. Olive Lewin. As a recording artist, he is certified in voice by the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM).


MUSICAL TRIBUTE: JENNIFER SMITH

GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY PROF. AKINYELE UMOJA



DR. AKINYELE OMOWALE UMOJA is an author, historian, and scholar-activist. Affectionately known as “Baba AK”, he is a Professor of Africana Studies at Georgia State University in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Umoja is the author of the award-winning book, *We Will Shoot Back: Armed Resistance and the Mississippi Freedom Movement* (2013). *We Will Shoot Back* has been designated as a seminal book in the NYU Classics collection. Professor Umoja is co-editor, with renowned scholar-activists Gloria Aneb House and the late John H. Bracey, *The Memoirs of Robert and Mabel Williams* (UNC, 2025). Umoja also co-edited another prizewinning publication, the two-volume *Black Power Encyclopedia* (Greenwood Press, 2018). His scholarship is featured in several other journals and anthologies, including editing a special issue of *The Black Scholar* (2018) on revolutionary activist, attorney, and Mayor of Jackson, Mississippi, Chokwe Lumumba and co-editing a special issue of the journal *SOULS* (2022) on the political legacy of activist health worker, freedom fighter, and political prisoner Dr. Mutulu Shakur. In addition, Professor Umoja has contributed to numerous documentaries, including the PBS Frontline “American Reckoning” (2022), HBO’s “Bastards of the Party” (2005), and BET’s “American Gangster” episode on Dr. Mutulu Shakur (2008). Dr. Umoja is also an internationally recognized scholar as he has presented his scholarship internationally in Germany, Spain, Haiti, and Venezuela, as well as is published in *Spanstival* in 1989, now approaching its 37th year.

Dr. Umoja is well recognized within the national scholarly community evidenced by his position as a Board member of the National Council of Black Studies and his previous service on the Advisory Board of the journal *The Black Scholar* (2013 – 2020). The National Council of Black Studies (in 2008 and 2025) and the National Conference of Black Political Scientists (1998) acknowledged him for his activism and contribution to civic engagement. Umoja was also inducted into Selma, Alabama’s Hall of Resistance in the Enslavement and Civil War Museum during the city’s annual Bridge Crossing and Jubilee Celebration in 2016.

Baba Umoja is a co-founder of the New Afrikan People’s Organization (NAPO) and the Malcolm X Grassroots Movement (MXGM), both organizations committed to human rights, self-determination, and reparations of African descendants in the United States and internationally. Along with his wife, educator Aminata Umoja, he and other comrades organized and initiated Atlanta’s first Malcolm X Festival in 1989, now approaching its 37th year.

FORMER STATE REPRESENTATIVE: DONNA MCLEOD



Donna T. McLeod (born March 19, 1968) is a Jamaican-born American politician from Georgia. McLeod is a former member of the Georgia House of Representatives from the 105th District from 2019 to 2023. She is the first Jamaican-American to become a Representative in Georgia.

McLeod served as the Committee Chair for Voter Outreach for the Gwinnett County Democratic Party and continues as an active member of the Gwinnett Democrats. She was a grassroots organizer for Senator Barack Obama's 2008 Presidential campaign, and in 2012, she served as National Director for Voter Outreach for Black Women for Obama. In 2016, she ran for State House Representative for District 105, Gwinnett County, GA, and was endorsed by President Barack Obama. She lost the general election to incumbent Joyce Chandler by 222 votes. McLeod ran again for State House Representative, District 105 in 2018 and was elected on November 6 with over 4000 votes, defeating Republican Donna Sheldon.

In 2018, she received endorsements from both President Barack Obama and Attorney General Eric Holder and ran for a third time in 2020, defeating Erik Dieks. During the 2019 Legislative Session, Representative McLeod worked with the Departments of Corrections and Community Services to update their release documents to ensure that Ex-Felons who have served their time will be informed that their Voting Rights are restored.

McLeod is a chemical engineer with over 30 years of experience in quality assurance management/ engineering; she is now the President & CEO of Enviroqual, LLC, a quality assurance/regulatory consulting company specializing in medical devices, food, plastics, and pharmaceuticals.

GEORGIA STATE REPRESENTATIVE DERRICK JACKSON



State Representative Derrick Jackson represents Georgia's 68th House District. He is a retired US Navy officer, corporate general manager, adjunct professor, non-profit board member, and community leader. He has worked with General Electric as the senior marketing manager for the industrial growth vertical and business development.

Derrick was "born to serve" and has no problem rolling up his sleeves to work hard to improve the quality of life throughout Georgia. He was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 2016 and again in 2023 in a special election. In June 2025, Jackson announced he would run for Governor in the 2026 Georgia gubernatorial election.

Rep. Jackson is currently enrolled in Walden University's Ph.D. program for public policy. He is married to CaMia Jackson, former state representative of House District 153. Their family consists of seven amazing young adults and one grandson.

We've all heard the saying, "There is nothing new under the sun." When it comes to music as an art form, this is not always accurate. History has confirmed that innovation is constant, especially in an industry you thought you knew. Speaking of which, in the reggae world comes an exceptional talent you should know, Richard "Koulie" Glass. Koulie turns every negative into positive energy. This drives him to make music to uplift the masses.

Born in Miami, Florida, to Jackie "Timi" Lynch, a Jamaican-born Harmony House recording artist and background singer for Beres Hammond, and Richard Glass, a prominent businessman and guitarist. Music has been in him since conception, and he utilizes his gift and musical influences to craft reggae music that illuminates the culture. Koulie's works are all unique, often paying homage to the greats before him. He sings fluently in true reggae fashion- a master of technique that coasts over strong reggae riddims.

Koulie recently joined forces with Kingston-based producer/engineer Colin "Bulby" York and linked also with Sizzla Kalonji at his home Judgement Yard in August Town, to collaborate on a new single available now on all streaming platforms titled "Rockers." Paul Kastick of Groove Galore Muzik, a member of Big Mountain and drummer for Diana King and Maxie Priest, gathered musicians to compose the "Rockers" single, landing Koulie an independent distribution deal with VPAL Music.

Koulie may still be new to the mainstream industry, but he is driven by passion and positivity; think of the essence of reggae; that's where you'll find Koulie. Truth is, he's not so new to the underground music scene. At just 16, he began performing at Vibes Nightclub in Decatur and received a positive response to his music. Since then, he's received standing ovations from audiences all over. Koulie wishes to contribute to making the world a better place through music. His goal is to spread the message of courage to youth, especially through Reggae. It is a cultural form that delivers a straightforward message easily identified by anyone listening. In the hands of a talented young man like Koulie, powerful reggae music will have a vast impact on making a brighter future for the masses. Koulie is forging his own path as an artist. Think of a young man driven by passion and positivity; think of the essence of reggae; that's where you'll find Koulie.

STEVEN GOLDING is the President of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and African Communities League ((UNIA-ACL) in Jamaica founded by the Right Excellent Marcus Garvey in 1914. A Professor of Garveyism, Golding chaired the Garvey studies department at the Hydel University in St. Catherine, Jamaica, and lectures on the philosophy of Marcus Garvey at the primary, secondary, and tertiary level, having also taught Garveyism as a rehabilitative program in Jamaica's general penitentiary and other correctional facilities. He is the founding director of Jamaica's only authentic African cuisine restaurant Café Africa and has served as Chairman of the African Caribbean Institute of Jamaica (ACIJ) & the Jamaica Memory Bank. He currently serves as a member of the Jamaican National Council on Reparations and as a director of the board for the Institute of Jamaica

Golding has hosted and executively produced media content on both radio and television since the early 2000s. He is the President of the Universal Negro Improvement Association & African Communities League (UNIA-ACL) founded in Jamaica by Marcus Garvey in 1914 and in 2024 he founded the Global Garvey Symposium Series that has launched in several US cities including Atlanta, Baltimore, Brooklyn, Philadelphia, and New York, as well as in several countries including Jamaica, Barbados, Costa Rica, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Trinidad & Tobago. Golding is the author of the Daddy Marcus Nursery Rhyme book which was developed as a teaching tool dedicated to decolonizing the early childhood educational curriculum in the English speaking Caribbean

Steven Golding is the son of Jamaica's 8th Prime Minister, Bruce Golding and a graduate of the Johns Hopkins University. He is married to Jamaican media personality Emprezz and together they have a son, Kush, and a daughter, Zipporah.


